We need a deep love for those who don't know Christ.

The longer a person is a Christian, the fewer non-Christian contacts we cultivate.

- We stay in the Holy Huddle or go back to the Unholy Huddle.
- Make "Crucial Appointments"

We are reluctant to communicate our faith for a number of reasons.

- Lack of skills...
- Fear of a negative reaction...
- Don't see the importance of it...


- Lack of compassion...
- Bad experience in the past...
- You say: "I'll just live the faith, not speak it."
- We don't know Christ for real...

If you love Jesus Christ...you will want others to know Him and love Him.

Not because we feel like it, but because we are obedient.

When we don't communicate our faith, the *enemy* rejoices.

The enemy does not want you to point others to JESUS.



Communicating Our Faith


1. People are eternally separated from God without Christ.




- 4. Christ commanded all true believers to communicate His love.

Sensitivity – Acts 8:26-27a

- A. A Strange Command
 - Out of the blue, God called a man Philip
 - Philip was doing God's assignment successfully...but God had another assignment in mind.
 - Philip was alert and ready to respond.



With very little information, he obeyed.

As you walk closely with Jesus, you will develop sensitivity to His leading.

B. God Knew The Details...He knew:

- All about the Ethiopian
- His position and prominence
- Why he had traveled to Jerusalem
- The hunger in his heart
- That he was on his way home

C. This Ethiopian proselyte to Judaism would influence the great pagan Gentile world.

Sensitivity – Acts 8:26-27a

D. Philip had a passion to reach people with the Gospel.

You will get bored with religious Christianity if you don't communicate your faith.

Availability – Acts 8:27b-29

Sensitivity will lead to availability.

God is not so much interested in your ability as He is in your availability.

Availability – Acts 8:27b-29

A. What hinders availability?

- Overcrowded schedules
- Not understanding the high priority of telling others about Jesus Christ.

Availability – Acts 8:27b-29

- B. What was going on?
 - The eunuch's social status:
 - A political leader from the 3rd world.
 - Secretary of the Treasury of the Candace Dynasty.

Availability – Acts 8:27b-29

- B. What was going on?
 - The eunuch's spiritual state:
 - He had been to church in Jerusalem.
 - He didn't get what he needed, but he was seeking.

Availability – Acts 8:27b-29

- B. What was going on?
 - He was reading Isaiah 53.
 - The Spirit prodded Philip... "GO FOR IT!"
 - Philip was obedient and it paid off.

KEY # 3-INITIATIVE

Initiative – Acts 8:30

- Philip took the initiative
- He was running next to the chariot.
- He proceeded with caution.
- He used: Patience, Intelligence, Skill
- He asked a question: learn to frame good questions.

We are to be bold but not brash.

KEY #4-TACTFULNESS


Tactfulness – Acts 8:30-34

- Notice the flow...
 - Philip listened.
 - The Ethiopian confessed his ignorance.
 - Philip awaited an invitation to come aboard.
 - He started where the man was and led him to Jesus.

KEY #4-TACTFULNESS

Tactfulness – Acts 8:30-34

- Notice the flow...
 - He didn't make the man feel foolish.
 - He showed genuine concern.
 - He upheld the dignity of the Ethiopian.
 - He was courteous I Peter 3:8



KEY # 4-TACTFULNESS

Tactfulness - Acts 8:30-34

- You don't lead a person to Christ through logic.
- · You declare the essentials of "joyful message."

Preciseness – Acts 8:34-35, 37-39

- Philip used:
 - No threats
 - No theological mumbo-jumbo

Preciseness – Acts 8:34-35, 37-39

A. Philip's focus was Jesus

- His person
- His work
- His love for sinners
- His perfect life
- His sacrificial death

Preciseness – Acts 8:34-35, 37-39

A. Philip's focus was Jesus

- His resurrection
- His offer of forgiveness and security
- His offer of purpose, hope and favor


Preciseness – Acts 8:34-35, 37-39

- He didn't focus on...
 - The institutional church
 - A particular denomination
 - Religion
 - Theological double-talk

- B. Come to the point!
 - What is a Christian?
- C. The result... (Acts 8:37-39)
 - 1. The eunuch trusted Christ.
 - 2. The eunuch confessed his faith (baptized)
 - 3. The eunuch rejoiced.






KEY # 6-DECISIVENESS

Decisiveness – Acts 8:36-39

- The eunuch wanted to be baptized.
- Philip put first things first...
 - Acceptance of the message of Christ.
 - Public acknowledgement of faith.
- You must ask a decisive question...

Is there any reason why you should not accept Christ?
